Joe facilitated a great Parasport awareness campaign with the involvement of alumni as well as the 'Sports Person of the Month' to celebrate the achievements of Team Leicester. A notable achievement is the implementation of a monthly university gym membership which not only offers flexibility but increases accessibility for those getting involved with fitness at the university.
